IDEAS FOR PARENTS

Encourage your child to identify noises like the vacuum, tap water, dogs barking, thunder, airplane, car, etc.

Read aloud to your child everyday.



Let your child help with simple chores such as putting away toys, or putting clothes in the laundry basket. Let your child name things you are using.

Do not expect toddlers to always share or take turns. Right now they are focused on learning to physically handle themselves and learning to talk. Gently remind them and learning to share will come later.

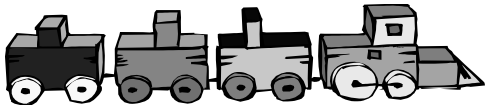
Mental Development

- Enjoys simple stories, rhymes, and songs
- Uses two-three word sentences
- Enjoys looking at books
- Says name of toys
- Repeats words



Physical Development

- Walks up and down stairs holding onto railing
- Has almost a full set of teeth
- Experiments by touching, smelling and tasting
- Can turn pages of a book
- Scribbles with crayons or markers
- May learn to use toilet
- Walks backwards



Two year olds are very busy therefore their focus of attention must be constantly guided for participation in a structured class.

Typically at this age, a parent is a home base, a safe place for the child to return to before venturing out to experience the world again. It is important that your child's first learning experience be positive and happy.

Self-esteem is important; each child needs to have their feelings and ideas respected. In Tiny Tumblers parent and teacher form a team, working together to turn every activity into a success.

Social & Emotional Development
